We will receive the official report towards the end of January 2023 and I will share this update with you in the new year. We continue to work closely with the Council project team and wider partners in relation to stage three of the Fairwater Campus Building Project. Stage three involves looking at the internal and external areas for both schools. There are currently a number of key discussion points for the project looking at parking and drop off, safeguarding and security, interior design strategy, community strategy and multi-agency strategy. Both Riverbank School and Woodlands School have held a number of parent/ carer engagement sessions to provide updates and opportunities for input into the design and wider project. There have also been staff engagement sessions to ensure their input in the process.

Since then, we have completed phase one of our project and as a result you will gradually begin to see our new branding on our communications. We will move onto phase two of our journey which will include the re-branding of our social media platforms and our Federation campus.

Highlights of







It has been a real privilege to take on the role of Head of School since September. This term has seen the school continue to move into a period of recovery from the COVID pandemic, the best example of this is perhaps the school Christmas Concert being back in the main hall. We continue to build on the excellent practice that exists within the school and I am pleased to share with you some of the highlights from the term.



Visit from the High Sheriff of **South Glamorgan**

We were delighted to welcome the High Sheriff, Rosie Moriarty-Simmonds OBE, back to Ty Gwyn school. Having previously been a member of the Governing Bodies for Ty Gwyn and the Western Learning Federation, Rosie returned to present a High Sheriff Award Certificate to the school in recognition of the immense work and support for children with severe and complex conditions together with the challenges which presented the school during the pandemic.

School Council Elections

This term the school held a large-scale pupil vote across the school in order to elect members to the School Council. The elections gave our pupils the opportunity to experience aspects of politics in a meaningful way. The school Eco Council and newer Criw Cymraeg (Welsh Crew) also link closely with the School Council which in turn links to the Federation Parliament.

Drama Room

A number of staff within the school have linked with a variety of health professionals to use drama to help pupils overcome anxiety in attending appointments. This term this project has moved into a dedicated drama studio resourced with bespoke materials. Pupils learn to overcome barriers in attending a wide range of appointments such as visiting hairdressers and doctors.









Healthy Schools

In 2008 we began our journey with the network Healthy Schools. Over the next decade we completed all of

the six phases of Healthy Schools awards. We then felt equipped to work toward the Healthy Schools National Quality Award (the highest award) and were delighted to receive our accreditation at the end of October 2022. The award comprises seven areas:

- Food and fitness (nutrition and physical activity)
- · Mental and emotional health and wellbeing, including staff wellbeing
- Personal development and relationships, including sex and relationships education
- Substance use and misuse, including alcohol, smoking, and drugs (legal, illegal, and prescription).
- Environment, including eco-initiatives and improving the school and wider environment
- Safety, including a variety of topics such as child protection, sun safety, internet safety, and first aid
- · Hygiene including across school and nonschool setting

Transition Event

Post-19 transition is a time of change for pupils. The school holds regular transition coffee mornings for parents and carers throughout the year. These are opportunities to discuss transition with other families as well as with professionals from Careers Wales and social services. This autumn we held a large-scale post-19 transition event in our main hall. A wide variety of Post-19 providers were present enabling direct access for parents and carers to assist with these key decisions for the future.



Christmas Concert

After 2 years where concerts needed to be virtual events, it was fantastic to welcome families and friends back into school for the Christmas Concert 2022. Pupils demonstrated great determination and resilience to perform in front of an audience, which for some pupils was a particularly big challenge to overcome. Thank you to staff and families for preparing pupils for this with great care. The result was two incredible concerts which we are extremely proud of. The official recording of the concert will be available soon.

Investors in Families

This term the school was assessed by Investors in Families. They reported that
